The California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office has set a goal of 80% implementation by fall 2013, and 100% implementation by fall 2014. Colleges in blue have met or exceeded the 80% goal. Colleges in orange still have a great deal of progress to make, having implemented half (40%) or less of the 80% goal for fall 2013. Note: A few colleges have an implementation progress rate of more than 100% because the majors of Philosophy and Spanish were developed after the targets were set.

*Values in blue are considered high-performing measures, and values in orange are considered low-performing measures. High-performance for the first two measures is considered to be 80% or greater, and low-performance is considered to be 60% or lower. For the last measure, high-performance is less than 10 and low-performance is 20 or greater.*

<sup>1</sup> The ratio provided in this column is the number of TMC major pathways declared similar as compared to the number of TMC majors offered at each campus. Not all CSU campuses offer all TMC majors.

<sup>2</sup> This measure demonstrates how many additional degree options need to be declared similar at each campus so that each of the two preceding columns would equal 100%. NOTE: There are a handful of campuses for which TMC majors have not been declared similar because all degree options within that major currently have a high-unit count.

<sup>3</sup> Northridge has one degree pathway pending similarity, which would increase major similarity to 92%. San Diego has 11 degree pathways that are pending similarity in 10 different majors, which would increase major similarity to 83%.
